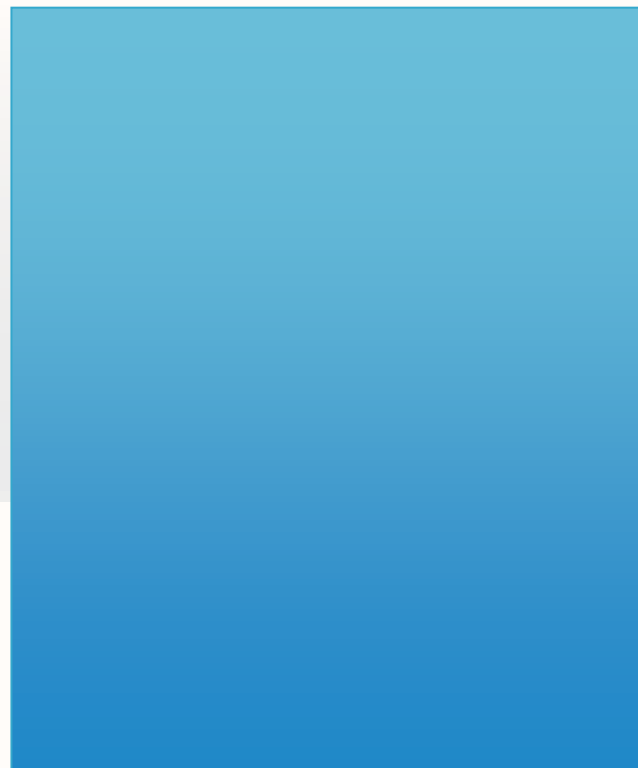

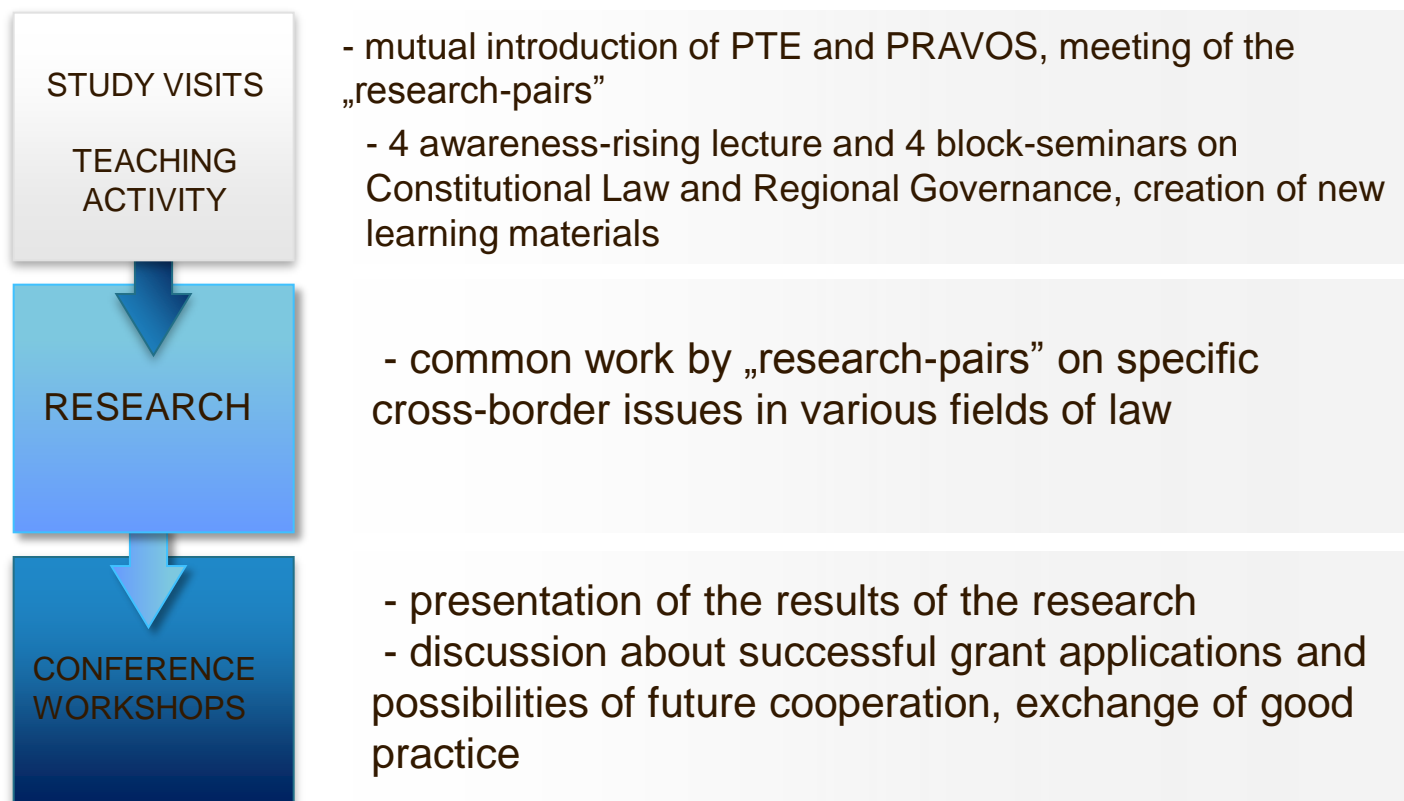

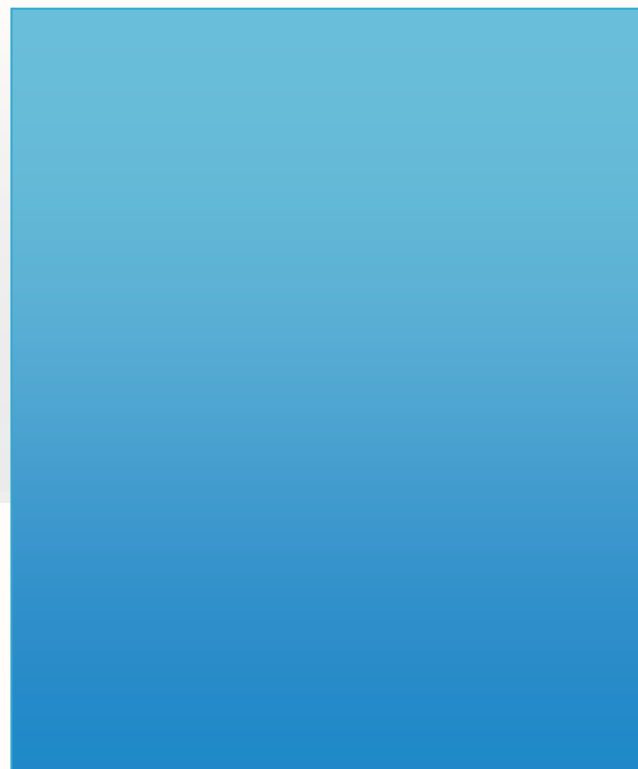

SUNICOP is thus a common research and curricula development project that includes common training on tendering as well as a summer school. SUNICOP is co-financed and supported by the European Union through the Hungary-Croatia IPA Cross-border Co-operation Program and the two participating law faculties.

KEY ASPECTS OF THE PROJECT DESCRIPTION

•Background

In the programme area cooperation in joint CBC education focuses on education and research, respectively. Based on a survey on demand, not only the two universities, but also the whole CBS area lacks an education course which has international development management (IDM) in its heart. IDM is vital to be taught as due to its different moduls (planning, implementation, competence development, etc.) it increases local and regional development capacities in the programme area, whilst it also strengthens the cooperation in the education sector with a new field of expertise made available. Knowing this, the project strives for preparing and piloting such an IDM course. The project has no connection with previous education projects.

Problems and challenges to be addressed

There are no educational courses on IDM in the cross border area. Consequently, the lack of competences, skills and knowledge in the specific field prevail in the cross border zone. This is also underpinned with the low level of cooperation culture in this specific field among the cross border educational organizations. The life long learning also requires having the necessary capacities, methodologies and good practices available, and this also has to be strengthened in the cross border zone. The survey on demand makes it clear that not only the available university courses, but also the formerly supported education, human resource development cross border projects did not address or make a step ahead regarding making IDM knowledge and skills available in the programme area.

Innovative character

The project is innovative, as not only deals with project management and programming, but also discusses the other aspects (intercultural skills, competences, with a wider EU and regional policy outlook, etc.) of the IDM. It merges the methods of the formal (lectures, case studies, etc.) and the informal (study visits) education. It is also supported by the presence of foreign (non-Hu and non-Hr) lectures so as to introduce new good practices and approaches with the participants. The IDM course is an effective tool for life long learning as it is open to persons and organizations irrespectively of their previous studies and education, to obtain new knowledge, skills and competences. The project also makes the cooperation of CBC education organizations more intensive by offering a new, innovative field (IDM) for their common work.

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Target groups

a) direct target groups

university students, colleagues of consulting companies, entrepreneurs, experts of public administration: they need skills, knowledge and competences so as to be able to prepare and implement international development programmes and projects. The education course helps them to obtain these by offering a chance to participate on a practice-oriented course with good practices to visit; lecturers and staff of the project partners: they will receive a modern curricula piloted in the project and following that it will be replicable (to prove for sustainability). Project partner staff can also apply it when working on a daily basis.

b) indirect target groups

staff and decision makers of the organizations delegating the participants of the course: they will have a properly educated staff, consequently they will be more prepared, flexible when managing international operations: educational organizations of the CBC area: they could broaden their educational supply.

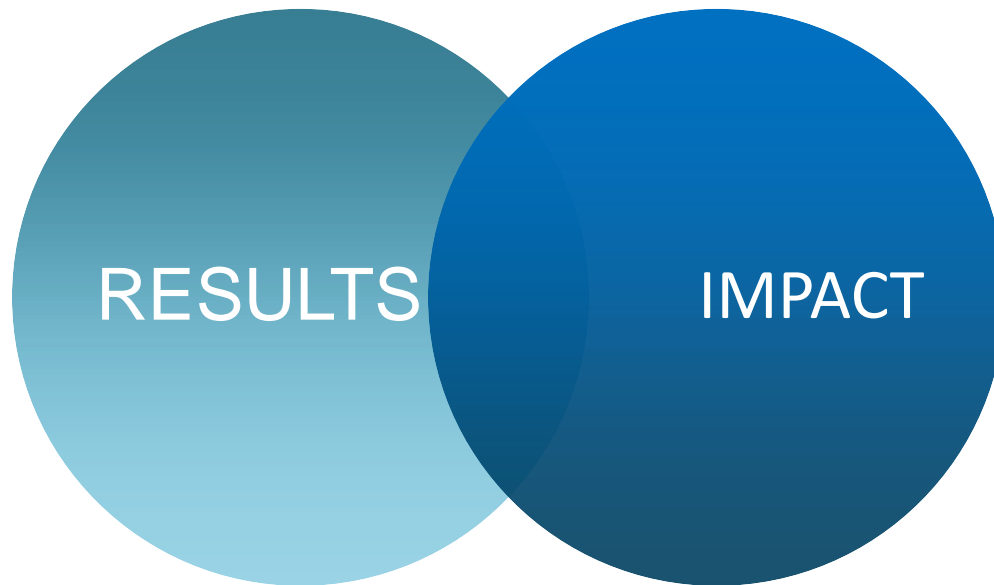

How does the project contribute to learning innovations and learning quality?



This project is innovative in Croatia, in particular on Faculty of Law in Osijek, as promotes study of EU Law not only through lectures for law students, but also through seminars and workshops to students of other profile (medicine, economics, engineering) and to practitioners who already work.

What are the main outcomes of the project?



Results: improved excellence of 3 professors, educated 150 students and 60 professionals on subjects/matters lectured in seminars and workshops.

Impact: improved teaching, research and enhanced knowledge and awareness of teachers, students and professionals on EU integration
